Tell us a little bit about what you are doing now.

I have recently graduated from the University of Warwick with a degree in History.

What A Level subjects did you take? Which was your favourite and why?

As well as History, which I saw as my strongest subject, I studied Philosophy and Ethics and I really looked forward to these lessons. During class we had helpful debates. My class and the teachers were really good and I think this has helped me with making persuasive arguments in my degree, as well as fully considering historiography.

What was your favourite extra-curricular activity at Mossbourne Sixth Form?

I took part in the Grocer Award, which is a Dragons' Den style of competition. Together with five friends, I created an app to help students find work. Tim Campbell attended the awards ceremony. It was a really good experience.

How did Mossbourne Sixth Form help you achieve your goals - academic, sporting, or personal - once you left school?

Mossbourne really helped me with preparing for the workplace and providing different work experience opportunities, such as my internship at a private equity firm.

I am now looking to move into film and documentary making and journalism. I was able to arrange work experience with a production company through a talk which Mossbourne organised.

I came to Mossbourne's sixth from another school and this also taught me resilience. I made new friends and adapted, with the support of the school. This was helpful preparation for university.

What's a piece of advice that you would like to give current and future Mossbournians of all ages?

When I was at Mossbourne we had talks every week from employers. I would advise students to make the most of those! Reach out to people and make connections - take those opportunities.
